

8D6N Adventures of Seoul & Jeju Island (8KASJ)

Day 1 ~ **KK >> SEOUL** Assemble at the airport. Take a flight to Seoul.

Day 2 ~ SEOUL – Bukchon Hanok Village – JEJU ISLAND – Ice Museum + 3D Trick Eye Museum (B/L/D)

Hotel: Jeju Benika Hotel /similar

- Bukchon Hanok Village: Bukchon Hanok Village is home to hundreds of traditional houses, called hanok, that date back to the Joseon Dynasty. The name Bukchon, which literally translates to "northern village," came about as the neighborhood lies north of two significant Seoul landmarks, Cheonggyecheon Stream and Jongno.
- Jeju Ice Museum: The first of its kind built in Jeju, exhibits the best sculptures that elevated the ice up to the state of art. Also, it provides an experience space where visitors can touch and feel the ice sculptures. Through this, you will be able to feel the unlimited changes of the ice.
- Jeju 3D Trick Eye Museum: The museum offers exciting and unique paintings created with a special technique to appear 3D. Visitors can create 'new' works of art by placing themselves into the famous paintings for a fun experience and one-of-a-kind souvenir photo.



Day 3 ~ Gimnyeong Maze Park – Manjanggul Cave – Jeju Mini Mini Land – Starlight World Park (B/L/D) Hotel: Jeju Benika Hotel /similar

• Gimnyeong Maze Park: Gimnyeong Maze Park contains a maze that has seven images incorporated in it. The maze is in the shape of the Jeju Island, and its images that can be clearly seen from above include the following: a serpent; native horses of Jeju Island; the ship, the Sparrowhawk; and dolmens that are relics from the Bronze Age. All of these images are famous symbols or landmarks of Jeju Island.



- Manjanggul Cave: Manjanggul Cave is one of the finest lava tunnels in the world, and is a designated natural monument. A lava tunnel is formed when the lava that was deep in the ground spouts from the peak and flows to the surface. Manjanggul Cave has a variety of interesting structures inside including 70cm lava stalagmites and the lava tube tunnels.
- Jeju Mini Mini Land: Jeju Mini Mini Land is a spacious park featuring miniature versions of famous attractions from around the world. Over 116 architectural wonders and UNESCO World Heritage sites from 50 different countries are represented in the park.



• Starlight World Park: Jeju Starlight World Park and Planetarium is a theme park that was established in 2009 for advancing research and studies in astronomy. Today, it is also used as a center for public astronomy education. It has 4D theater, a planetarium, a twostory exhibition hall showcasing outer space journey, as well as several meeting/conference facilities. There is also a sundial and two observation binoculars on the outdoor square.



Day 4 ~ JEJU ISLAND - SEOUL -The Morning Calm Arboretum – Rail Bike (B/L/D) Hotel: Yeoju Sun Valley Resort /similar

- The Morning Calm Arboretum: The garden is the oldest private garden in Korea. It is an artistic space with a beautiful balance between the Korean concept of natural curves with asymmetry, and plants with synthetic materials, attracting about 600,000 visitors annually. Scenic walkways, beautifully manicured grass, and flower beds connect the garden's 20 different themed sections.
 - * Spring: Spring Garden Festival
 - Summer: Festival of Roses, Hydrangeas and Roses of Sharon
 - * Autumn: Festival of Chrysanthemums and Autumnal Tints
 - * Winter: Lighting Festival



• Rail Bike: This route is featured in the Korean film 'The Letter (편지, 1997)', and thus loved by both love birds and photographers who like to capture some beautiful scenes along the old rail bike track. Visitors on the bikes will also get to enjoy the beautiful river view presented below the bridge while riding, as well as taking advantage of having a light exercise with your loved ones.





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Day 5 ~ Fruit Farm (Picking Experience) -DIY Kimchi (Making Experience + experience wearing Hanbok) - Gwangmyeong Cave - Dongdaemun Market (B/L/D) Hotel:Benikia Dongdaemun Hotel/ similar

• Fruit Farm: Korean fruit picking is always an exciting and fruitful experience. There are different kinds of fruits in every different seasons, and it also depends on the weather. It's an experience like no other! (Types of fruits depends on weathers)



- DIY Kimchi + Hanbok: You can learn Korean history and culture through DIY Kimchi! Participants can taste the kimchi they make, have it packed up, and take it home with them. Hanbok(Korea's Traditional Clothing) expresses Korea's true characteristics in terms of culture and history. Just like chipao from China and kimono from Japan, Korea also boasts its own traditional garb, though people nowadays wear them only on special occasions or during national holidays.
- Gwangmyeong Cave: Gwangmyeong Cave is where joys and tears of coal mining workers remained intact. It was the heart of the evolution of modern industries in Korea and also a historical site of the Japanese colonial period. It takes pride itself as being the only one cave found in the metropolitan cities.



• Dongdaemun Market: Dongdaemun has every fashion item imaginable: fabric, clothes, accessories, and wedding goods. It is home to the largest clothing suppliers in Korea. Cheap and diverse clothes attract not just fashion leaders but also the average consumer. It has become a place frequented by major Korean and international buyers as well.

Day 6 ~ Lotte World Theme Park - Lotte World Mall (B/L/D)

Hotel:Benikia Dongdaemun Hotel/similar

• Lotte World Theme Park: Lotte World is divided into an indoor Adventure theme, and Magic Island theme outdoors, next to Seokchonhosu Lake. Lotte World Adventure has districts representing different countries with various kinds of facilities and souvenir shops.



• Lotte World Mall: Lotte World Mall is one of the most recent opened malls in Seoul. You'll notice a very tall polished building that stands out at Jamsil station. It has a department store, duty free shop,aquarium, Himart (electronic goods store), Lotte Aquarium and cinema all at one building.

Day 7 ~ Seoul City Tour - Seoul N Tower Square - Duty free shop - Myeongdong Street (B/L/D)

Hotel:Benikia Dongdaemun Hotel/similar

• Gyeongbok Palace: Gyeongbok Palace is arguably the most beautiful, and remains the largest of all five palaces. The premises were once destroyed by fire during the Imjin War (Japanese Invasions, 1592-1598). However, all of the palace buildings were later restored under the leadership of Heungseondaewongun during the reign of King Gojong (1852-1919).

- National Folklore Museum: Located inside Gyeongbokgung Palace, the National Folk Museum of Korea presents over 4,000 historical artifacts that were used in the daily lives of ordinary Korean people. It has three permanent and two special exhibitions as well as a library, souvenir shop, and other subsidiary facilities.
- Blue House: The signature markings of the Presidential Residence of Cheong Wa Dae are its blue tiles. The unique buildings of Cheong Wa Dae are comprised of the Main Office, Yeongbingwan (Guest House), Chunchugwan (Spring and Autumn Pavilion), Nokjiwon (Green grass), the Mugunghwa (Rose of Sharon) Valley, and the Seven Palaces. They are unique and beautifully designed, built in the Korean traditional style.



- Seoul N Tower Square: Namsan Seoul Tower was the first tower-type tourism spot in Korea. The top of the tower is at almost 480m above sea level, making it one of the tallest towers in the Orient. This place has now become a popular date spot for couples. Like the Pont Neuf bridge in Paris, couples head to the tower to lock their "padlock of love" onto the railing and to dream that their love will last forever.
- Myeongdong Street: Myeong-dong is one of the primary shopping districts in Seoul. Common products for sale include clothes, shoes, and accessories. In addition, several major department stores have branches here, including Lotte Department Store, Shinsegae Department Store, Myeong-dong Migliore, Noon Square and M Plaza. The department stores carry many premium labels and other fashionable goods at reasonable prices.
