



# 8D6N Discover Best of Seoul & Jeju Island (8KDSJ)

## Day 1 ~ KK ✈️ SEOUL

- Assemble at the airport. Take a flight to Seoul.

## Day 2 ~ SEOUL - JEJU ISLAND - Mysterious Road - Dragon Head Rock (B/L/D)

Hotel: Jeju Benika Hotel / Similar

- **Mysterious Road:** The Mysterious Road or the Dokkaebi Road in Jeju Island is one of the numerous magnetic hills scattered around the world. A slight downhill slope appears to be an uphill slope due to the seemingly high surroundings, creating an optical illusion that objects roll uphill.
- **Dragon Head Rock:** From Yongduam, visitors can see Haeneo women divers working on catching seafood. Near the rock are various cafes, bars, and restaurants. The coastal road between Aewol-up and Yongduam is a popular spot for couples. Cafes and seafood restaurants began to appear there five years ago and now form a pleasant café village.



## Day 3 ~ Seongsan Sunrise Peak - Seongeup Folk Village - Seopjikoji Hills - Glass Castle - Solloc Tea Museum (B/L/D)

Hotel: Jeju Benika Hotel / Similar

- **Seongsan Sunrise Peak:** It rose from under the sea in a volcanic eruption over 100,000 years ago. There is a huge crater at the top of Seongsan Ilchulbong Peak. The crater is about 600m in diameter and 90m high. With the 99 sharp rocks surrounding the crater, it looks like a gigantic crown.



- **Seongeup Folk Village:** The Seongeup Folk Village shows the unique culture of Jeju Island: the black lava rock walls, the straight but curvy alleys to block the wind, and the stone grandfather statues (Harubang), which have become a prime feature of the landscape.
- **Seopjikoji Hills:** "Seopji" is the old name for the area, and "Koji" is Jeju dialect meaning a sudden bump on land. On Koji hill which is wide and flat, there stands a stone Bongsudae called 'Hyeopjayeon' with a 4m height and 9m length and width that has retained its original form.



- **Glass Castle:** Jeju Glass Castle' is a glass art theme park featuring an exhibition hall, garden and models all made entirely out of glass. These include the world's very first all-glass labyrinth. There are also glass art masterpieces by internationally famous artists from Italy. Visitors to 'Jeju Glass Castle' can even experience making glass artwork.



- **O'Solloc Tea Museum:** teaches visitors about Korea's traditional tea culture. The "o" in "o'sulloc", means to appreciate and enjoy, and it also stands for the 'origin of sulloc', 'only sulloc', and 'of sulloc tea'. The entire building takes the shape of a green tea cup. It seeks to harmonize the cultures of the West and East, and past traditions with the modern world.



## Day 4 ~ SEOUL - Petite France - Nami Island (B/L/D)

Hotel: Yangpyeong Bloom Vista / Similar

- **Petite France:** The concept of Petite France encapsulates 'flowers, stars, and the Little Prince.' The village contains a memorial hall dedicated to Saint-Exupery, the author of the celebrated French novel, Le Petit Prince (1943). It also has a gallery displaying sculptures and paintings of le coq gaulois (the Gallic rooster), the national symbol of France; Orgel House where a 200-year-old music box plays a sweet melody; a shop that sells herbal and aromatic products; a souvenir shop; and many other locales where you can experience French culture.
- **Nami Island:** Namiseom Island was formed as a result of the construction of Cheongpyeong Dam. It is a half moon-shaped isle, and is famous for its beautiful tree lined roads. A special feature of Namiseom Island is that there are no telephone poles. This is because all electric wires were built underground to keep the natural feeling of the landscape. It's also one of the shooting scenes of a famous Korean Drama 'Winter Sonata'.



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**Day 5 ~ Mt. Sorak - Daepohang Fish Market (B/L/D)**

**Hotel: Sorak Hanhwa Resort / Similar**

• **Mt Sorak National Park:** The mountain was named Seorak ('Seol' meaning 'snow' and 'Ak' meaning 'big mountain') because the snow would not melt for a long time keeping the rocks in a permanent state of white. There are numerous valleys in NaeSeorak. Follow the Baekdamcheon Valley where all the streams meet and you will reach Baekdamsa Temple, which is known for its beautiful scenery.

(Include Kwunkeum castle by cable car, Sinheung Temple)



• **Daepohang Fish Market:** At Daepohang Port it is said that the Seorak Mountains and the East Sea are gifts from nature. The port is filled with raw fish restaurants and a live fish market containing eel, flatfish, flounder, yellowtail, and plethora of other high-end seafood.

**Day 6 ~ Everland Theme Park - Dongdaemun Market (B/L/D)**

**Hotel: Benikia Dongdaemun Hotel / Similar**

• **Everland Theme Park:** Everland Resort entertains visitors all year long with various rides, festivals like Global Fair, theme parks including Magic Land, European Adventure and Zootopia, perfect for a great amusement park. One of the park's most famous rides is T-Express, Korea's first wooden roller coaster, popular among young visitors.

• **Dongdaemun Market:** Dongdaemun has every fashion item imaginable: fabric, clothes, accessories, and wedding goods. It is home to the largest clothing suppliers in Korea. Cheap and diverse clothes attract not just fashion leaders but also the average consumer. It has become a place frequented by major Korean and international buyers as well.

**Day 7 ~ Seoul City Tour - Seoul N Tower Square - Duty free shop - Myeongdong Street (B/L/D)**

**Hotel: Benikia Dongdaemun Hotel / Similar**

• **Gyeongbok Palace:** Gyeongbok Palace is arguably the most beautiful, and remains the largest of all five palaces. The premises were once destroyed by fire during the Imjin War (Japanese Invasions, 1592-1598). However, all of the palace buildings were later restored under the leadership of Heungseondaewongun during the reign of King Gojong (1852-1919).

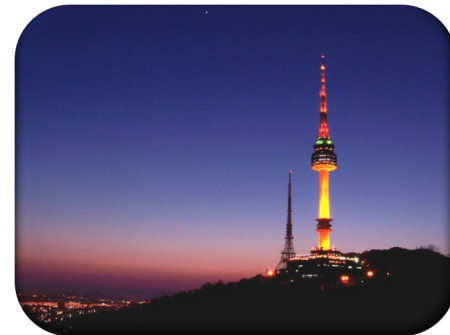
• **National Folklore Museum:** Located inside Gyeongbokgung Palace, the National Folk Museum of Korea presents over 4,000 historical artifacts that were used in the daily lives of ordinary Korean people. It has three permanent and two special exhibitions as well as a library, souvenir shop, and other subsidiary facilities.



• **Blue House:** The signature markings of the Presidential Residence of Cheong Wa Dae are its blue tiles. The unique buildings of Cheong Wa Dae are comprised of the Main Office, Yeongbingwan (Guest House), Chunchugwan (Spring and Autumn Pavilion), Nokjiwon (Green grass), the Mugunghwa (Rose of Sharon) Valley, and the Seven Palaces. They are unique and beautifully designed, built in the Korean traditional style.



• **Seoul N Tower Square:** Namsan Seoul Tower was the first tower-type tourism spot in Korea. The top of the tower is at almost 480m above sea level, making it one of the tallest towers in the Orient. This place has now become a popular date spot for couples. Like the Pont Neuf bridge in Paris, couples head to the tower to lock their "padlock of love" onto the railing and to dream that their love will last forever.



• **Myeongdong Street:** Myeong-dong is one of the primary shopping districts in Seoul. Common products for sale include clothes, shoes, and accessories. In addition, several major department stores have branches here, including Lotte Department Store, Shinsegae Department Store, Myeong-dong Migliore, Noon Square and M Plaza. The department stores carry many premium labels and other fashionable goods at reasonable prices.
